

Gaat u binnenkort met ontslag? (Engels)

Are you being discharged soon?

You may have taken medication during your hospital stay. When you return home, it is important that we properly and completely transfer all information about your medication use to other healthcare providers, such as your general practitioner or nursing home doctor and your pharmacy. This is to guarantee your safety.

The hospital may also have prescribed **medication** that you should take at **home**.

If you collect your medication from the Outpatient Pharmacy before you leave, we will check whether the medicine you took at the hospital can also be taken safely at home.

You will receive an up-to-date medication overview with all the medicines that you must continue to take. This includes any changes to medication and those you no longer need.

If you have any questions about your medication, then we can discuss these with you.

We will also send the medication overview to your pharmacy to ensure that your file remains up-to-date.

If you can't go to the Outpatient Pharmacy, then this conversation can also take place at your bedside in the nursing department, or we can forward the prescription to your pharmacy.

The Outpatient Pharmacy of the Albert Schweitzer Hospital is open from Monday - Friday from 8:00 am to 5:30 pm.
